The International Architecture Biennale Rotterdam (IABR) is an international research biennale founded in 2001 on the conviction that architecture is a public concern. It is an international event of exhibitions, conferences, lectures and other activities devoted to themes in the field of architecture and urbanism.

The 4th edition of the IABR will take place from 25 September 2009 until 10 January 2010 in Rotterdam and Amsterdam. Central venue of the 4th IABR is the NAI. The theme is Open City: Designing Coexistence. The 4th IABR's curator is Dutch architect and urbanist Kees Christiaanse, who teaches at the ETH Zurich and is a partner in KCAP Rotterdam. In addition to three exhibitions, the 4th IABR is laying on a sizeable Event Program at the NAI, including debates, lectures, theatre performances and film screenings.

Occupying a monumental example of Nieuwe Bouwen architecture of the functionalist Dutch arm of the International Modern style, since 1993, the Chabot Museum boasts one of the most important collections of work by the painter and sculptor Henk Chabot (1894-1949), a Dutch expressionist and complements this with work by Chabot's contemporaries. The museum organizes a dynamic, international exhibition program on the basis of this collection. A book showcasing the

architecture and restoration of this building, which was listed as a National Monument in 2000, along with the Chabot Museum's collection and its policy as a museum, is launched this September. Photographs by Rotterdam-based photographer Jannes Linders take the reader on an alluring voyage of discovery through the area around the Chabot Museum and the ensemble of white villas to which the property belongs. This verdant little neighborhood, situated opposite the Museum Boijmans Van Beuningen and the Netherlands Architecture Institute, is a unique location in the city centre.

The book Villa Park in The City will be available from the end of September 2009, for 24,50 Euro from the Museum's bookshop.
